



Animals

The type and quantity of animals you are allowed to keep is dependent upon the zoning and acreage of your property.

It May Cost You...

Consequences for non-compliance:
1) Your property may be subjected to the County's abatement process. **
2) A Notice of Pendency may be recorded against your property which may interrupt the sale of your property or the re-financing of existing loans attached to the property.
3) You may be subjected to administrative citations with penalty assessments ranging from \$100.00 to \$500.00 per violation.
4) You may be subjected to a misdemeanor citation with fines up to \$1000.00 and imprisonment in a County detention facility for up to 6 months or both.

The keeping of non-domesticated animals such as horses, cows, roosters/hens, sheep, goats, and pigs are regulated by the Riverside County Land Use Ordinance No. 348. The type and quantity of animals you are allowed to keep is dependent upon the zoning and the acreage of your property. You may be asked to reduce the type and number of non-domesticated animals being kept on your property. Please contact your local Code Enforcement office for additional information.

Definition: Crowing Fowl are defined as chickens, peafowl and guinea fowl.

Zoning and Acreage Allowances for Crowing Fowl

The following table shows how many crowing fowl are allowed. The number of crowing fowl is based on zoning classifications and lot sizes of 7200 sq. ft. or higher. Crowing fowl are not allowed to be kept on any lot that is less than 7200 sq. ft. Property owners can find out the zoning of their property by calling the Planning Department at (951) 955-3200 or visiting the County website at http://www.ce.rtlma.org

Distance Requirements

In each zone where crowing fowl are permitted, they must be kept in an enclosed area in the backyard, no less than 20 feet from any property line and no less than 50 feet from any residence.

Additional Crowing Fowl Information

If a property owner would like to exceed up to 50% of the number of hens, roosters, or total of crowing fowl permitted, and the property is within an appropriate zone, they can submit an application for a Crowing Fowl Permit to the Planning Department. The application for a Crowing Fowl Permit is subject to notification of neighbors within 600 feet of the property boundary and to a public hearing if a request is made.
